Darlene Banducci a true country girl. She was born in rural Fresno County and attended school in Kerman, CA. She grew up with two brothers and one sister, who is still living. Kerman is a farming community, where many, including her family, raised grapes for raisins.



After graduating from Fresno State with a degree in home economics, Darlene moved to Oakdale to take a job at the local high school. One day, a member of the office staff invited Darlene and her girlfriends to visit her family's ranch, where they met her brother, Roy. With four women to choose from, Roy ultimately set his sights on Darlene. It took him a week to call and ask her to dinner—along with some married friends who were all expecting babies at the time. After dating for about a year, they went shopping on Valentine's Day and ended up at a jewelry store, where they bought a ring to "seal the deal." Married for 58 years, Darlene and Roy built a life together, raising a son and two daughters. They were later blessed with two grandchildren and three great-grandchildren, with a fourth great-grandchild due to arrive in July.

Being married to a devout Catholic, Darlene attended the Catholic Church with Roy for 10 years until they had a falling out with the congregation. Since she had previously been a member of the Kerman Methodist Church, they began attending CUMC when it was still in the stone building.

In between raising three children, Darlene taught home economics at the high school, junior high, and continuation school, eventually retiring 34 years ago. She primarily taught cooking—perhaps the reason her cookies are so delicious. A talented seamstress, Darlene has also sewn banners for the church and crafted kneeling pads. She and Roy used to update the church bulletin boards every month. Additionally, Darlene took charge of stocking and maintaining the church kitchen, ensuring it was kept clean and ready for the many meals prepared there.

Now facing vision loss due to macular degeneration and a burst vessel in one eye, Darlene at 92, continues to live in her home on their ranch with the support of caregivers.
